SCHOOL PROFILE

Beechwood Elementary School offers a Francais-Plus Program to approximately 250 students from Kindergarten to Grade 6. The school is located in Pierrefonds, Québec, Canada and draws its students from both the cities of Pierrefonds and Dollard-des- Ormeaux.

The school campus includes a natural green space, park benches, a soccer and baseball field, an outdoor classroom, a designated paved hockey and basketball area, as well as a separate fenced in playground with jungle gyms for the Kindergarten classes.

Our facility includes a library, gymnasium, resource room, a stage and daycare facilities.

Parents are considered partners with the school. Our Governing Board and Home and School Association volunteers contribute to student life and are involved in the daily functioning of the school. Their assistance in the library, school activities, fundraising efforts and support for field trips enhance the overall academic and social experience for our students.

Literacy is also a top priority, ensuring our children develop strong literacy skills, in both French and English, through various programs.
